## ANNE FRANK-THE DIARY OF A YOUNG GIRL

### GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR DIARY RESPONSES:

- 1) Put the date of the entry clearly next to your response and underline or highlight it. Each entry should also be numbered.
- 2) Neatly write each response using complete sentences and correct grammar. Skip at least **1-2 lines** between entry responses.
- 3) Write one paragraph that tells your personal interpretations, ideas, reactions, etc. to the entry's content.

### *HERE ARE THE REQUIRED READINGS*

#### To qualify for an "A"

YOU MUST DO ALL OF THE ENTRIES LISTED(40) Responses must be thorough and exceptional in quality. The summaries and your thoughts must be accurate and show depth of thought. Your sentence structure, mechanics, etc. will be evaluated.

#### To qualify for a "B"

YOU MUST DO **30** ENTRIES OF YOUR CHOICE. These must include the introduction and afterward. Responses must be above average in quality and accurately reflect the accounts of Anne. Your sentence structure, mechanics, etc. will be evaluated.

#### To qualify for a "C"

YOU MUST DO **20** ENTRIES OF YOUR CHOICE. These must include the Introduction and Afterward. Responses must be accurate and thorough. Your sentence structure, mechanics, etc. will be evaluated.

## VERY IMPORTANT!

If you are working toward a "B" or "C" you must attempt to choose approximately the same number of entries from each of the three groups.


