

Trimester 3 Extra Credit Options:

Due May 31st

**To get the extra credit, you need to turn in all assignments from 5/1 to the end of the year and turn in your Anne Frank Project on time.

1) Connections to another World War 2 Book: (15 points)

Step 1: Pick a another book for World War 2. There are options at the front of the classroom from non-fiction books to historical fiction novels.

Step 2: Read the book (you can count this book on your reading log).

Step 3: Two Options

Option 1: On an unlined sheet of paper, create a web of connections. In the four corners, write: the title of your chosen book, The Diary of Anne Frank, Background Knowledge, and, if you saw it, Swing Kids. (If you would like an example, see Ms. Schumacher). You need to have at least four quality connections between each book.

Option 2: Type up a page-long review (double-spaced) of the book you chose to read. In paragraph one, describe the plot, but don't give away spoilers, and give your opinion of the book (make sure to explain why it was or wasn't good. Paragraph two should describe the connections between the book you choose and Anne Frank.

2) World War 2 Article: (5 points) (Can read up to two articles)

Go to <https://newsela.com/text-sets/9459/books--anne-frank> . Read one of the articles in This text set and write one paragraphs that gives a brief summary. Write a second paragraph where you make connections to Anne Frank or other Holocaust information we have learned.

3) Creative Response: (10 points)

Write a poem or create a piece of art that is inspired by Anne Frank. **This should be a thoughtful illustration or response.** It will be graded on the effort you put into it. This should not be a simple drawing of Anne. If you are unsure of whether your work is thoughtful enough, show it to Ms. Schumacher.

Along with the artwork, add one quote from Anne Frank and explain how your artwork illustrates this quote.
